

CITY OF SAN JOSE DEL MONTE

First relocation project of the Marcos Administration in 1960.

It has 8 relocation areas for informal settlers

Converted into a component city in September 10, 2000

Composed of 2 districts with 59 barangays

It has seven Growth Areas

Population is more than 500,000

An average of 500-1000 families were relocated every year

- 70% of its population belongs to the poverty level
- It has 149 subdivisions
